



Pet Addendum

At Westaway's Getaways, we understand that your pet is a family member and an important part of your vacation experience. Our pet-friendly rental policy lets you keep the entire family together. However, there are some rules and regulations you must agree to before experiencing the great outdoors with one of our motorhomes. Before you book your next pet-friendly trip, be sure to familiarize yourself with Westaway's Getaways rental policy and pet addendum.

Rental Charges

- An additional \$10.00 per night
- An Additional \$100.00 security deposit

What is an Invisible Pet?

Westaway's Getaways believes in the "invisible pet." We should not smell or see any signs that there was ever an animal in the unit when the motorhome is returned. This includes but is not limited to:

- Pet Hair
- Carpet and/or fabric stains
- Carpet and/or fabric tears
- Damage of window coverings
- Panel or wood trim damage
- Pet food
- Smell or odor associated with an animal

Restrictions

Before you depart on your vacation, we require you to advise us of your pet in writing.

- One dog is allowed in designated motorhome. Sorry dogs only. If you have a service animal that is not a dog. Please contact us.
- If you decide to leave the dog unattended in the RV, it must be kept in a kennel. Your pet may not have “free roaming” of the RV while you are away.
- We ask that you please not allow your dog on ANY of the furniture in the unit. This includes seats, sofas, dinette area, overhead bunks or beds.

If Evidence of a Pet is Found

- Excessive cleaning and fumigation will incur additional charges.
- Any permanent damage will result in paying the cost of parts and labor to repair at the discretion of Westaway’s Getaways.

If evidence of a pet is found and it was NOT disclosed at the time of reservation, you will be subject to a \$40 per night fee for the entire period of your rental.

Before you start booking your vacation, be sure to inform yourself of any RV park rules and pet policies for once you arrive at your destination. Some parks don’t allow dogs over a certain size, and others require animals to be on leashes at all times. Contact your RV park destination in advance to ask for more pet-related rules and details to get a better idea of how friendly their pet policy may be.
